1. Objectives

- Demonstrate the validity of Fidel Castro's legacy through his meetings with prominent figures of US progressive figures like Malcolm X and Rev. Lucius Walker.
- Discuss Fidel Castro's antiracist thoughts and their impact on Cuba and the world, especially for new men and women leaders who have emerged during the past six decades fighting for justice.
- Valuate the relevance of the transdisciplinary study of this collective legacy to be included in the university curriculum.

- Interaction via Zoom with other specialists

Paper presentations: Professors and researchers, activists and social fighters are invited to present papers that delve into the legacy of these leaders for the new generation of men and women social leaders as well as its relevance for the university curricula.

3. Norms for presentation and publication

Participants should inscribe and submit an abstract to the website of the Convention. Abstracts should be one paragraph, no more than 250 words, not counting title and affiliation.



Title: in bold

Author(s): Name and surname (underline the presenter), email, affiliation, with subscripts after the name and institution below each name.

Structure of the resume: antecedents, results and conclusions.

Papers will be selected by the Scientific Committee, who will decide their acceptance and the modality of presentation, whether oral or poster presentation.
