### Aim and Scope

The international Open Science movement aims to make science more inclusive, collaborative, participatory, understandable, accessible, reusable, transparent, and efficient in responding to global challenges and beneficial to all. Progress towards Open Science contributes to reducing gaps in access to scientific data and information and also to bridge digital, technological, gender and knowledge gaps. However, this implies changes in scientific practices and management.

The first Symposium on Open Science in Cuba 2023 seeks to identify what has been done, what we can effectively do from universities to open Science and how we can contribute to generalize its practice in the country. The symposium is structured in sessions that aim to share good practices, create synergies thanks to the exchange with experts from organizations and leaders of national and international projects dedicated to promote the implementation of Open Science.





The symposium provides a forum for researchers, academics, scientific publishers, librarians, infrastructure providers and developers, science policy makers and other important stakeholders in the debate on Open Science and its impact on the academic sector. # Submission procedure

The following types of submissions are invited:

- Full papers (12 pages) reporting completed research
- Short papers (6 pages) presenting ongoing or preliminary research

Submissions should be original and not previously submitted, published and under review to other Conferences or Journals. All submissions will be reviewed on the basis of relevance, originality, importance and clarity following a double-blind peer review process. Submitted papers must follow the Symposium formatting style and guidelines (more details provided in available templates). Authors of accepted submissions will be asked to register to the
