About our event





Inauguration act



It will begin this edition with a Solemn Act from the Aula Magna of the University of Havana (famous for its historical and artistic values) with the words of the event authorities and a beautiful cultural program.

Cultural gala of amateur artists:



Cultural activity where different artistic manifestations of the solid amateur artists movement of the university will be presented. The delegates who so wish can participate through an artistic manifestation.

Central workshops:



Is one of the new features of our edition. Through the methodology of Popular Education, people who attend the workshops will be able to reflect together (in workteams or in plenary), about central questions about formation, social challenges, use of networks and other topics. It will combine the use of other methodologies, like Psychodrama.

Master lectures:



Lectures are a great gift for the attendees. From the venue or other countries, prestigious professionals talk about the different areas of performance of Psychology and related sciences.

Commission work:



It is the core of the scientific exchange in the event. They are grouped into thematic lines of the event and discussions are organized in the form of panels and workshops. Debate, professional and humane exchange and scientific learning prevail. The spaces are coordinated by students from the Scientific Comission prepared for this purpose.

Nationalitys fair:



It is an activity aimed to share cultural experiences from the nations present in the event. The delegates can present photos, coloquial phrases, costumes, dances, food and other elements. It is organized in the courtyard of the Faculty of Psychology and it will be open to the community.

Great Community Fair:



It is a place that aims to bring already established projects, ideas in the making or knowledge to action, through interaction with the community and every person that wishes to participate virtually. Its main goals are to promote psychological well-being, foster skills and provide tools to enrich the daily lives of the members of the community where the Faculty of Psychology, the event venue, is located.

Spontaneous Theater Group of Havana:



This group achieves to make the audience the protagonist of the scene, for they are the ones who tell their personal stories and then are represented when the actors perform them.

Especialized Visits:



The delegates, after being registered for this activity, will be able to visit health and educations centers, among others, where the work of the professional psychologist is present.

Ways to Participate

You can participate as a speaker (presenting some work) or listener. They can both be made face to face or virtually.

Important dates

- Opening of inscriptions and abstracts acceptance: October, 2023
- Abstract submission: until March 1st, 2024
- Abstract evaluation: up to 15 days after its reception
- Last date to make your inscription for your work to appear in the scientific program: March 20th, 2024

I am interested in being a speaker, how do I submit my abstract?

The Scientific Commission will evaluate every work. In order to do so, the contributions must have an abstract, sent via our webpage which can be accessed <u>here</u>.

We accept contributions in Spanish, Portuguese, English and French. You will be able to participate in any of the languages mentioned, but we do not offer simultaneous translation.

Only the authors who are inscribed in the congress receive a participation certificate.

Abstracts must meet the following requirements:

- Title: With no capital letters or quotation marks, except the initial letter and proper nouns. It should convey the main idea of the abstract.
- Extensive abstract: It must contain the necessary information between 1500 and 3000 characters, with the following sections:
 - o Empirical investigations: Introduction, Objectives, Method, Results and Conclusions. The subtitles must be included in the abstract. References must not be included.
 - o Non-empirical works: Introduction, Objectives, Covered topics, Conclusions.
- Keywords: 3 to 5, separated by commas.

In which modality can I present my work?

As it is a hybrid event, you can participate both face to face and virtually. In the latter, you can choose to make your presentation synchronically or non-synchronically, depending on the modality you choose.

Book Presentations	It is a space dedicated to the dissemination and analysis of texts published in the field, scientific and academic. The authors have the opportunity to present their publications, highlighting it's purpose, the main content and contribution of their work to the field of knowledge.
